Communiqué

About seventy clean energy industry and community leaders met in Adelaide today for a Clean Energy Summit to discuss the need for continued investment in renewable energy in Australia.

The Summit was called by Premier Jay Weatherill on the back of continuing uncertainty in the renewable energy sector arising from the Federal Government's review of the Renewable Energy Target (RET) scheme, a target that has enjoyed bipartisan support for more than a decade.

The Summit resolved to call on the Abbott Government to abandon any amendments to the existing Renewable Energy Target that would jeopardise employment and investment.

The Summit heard how change to the Renewable Energy Target will jeopardise tens of thousands of jobs around the Country, many involved in working in local communities in country areas.

Attendees also heard how uncertainty around the Renewable Energy Target has already jeopardised billions of dollars of proposed investment and effectively stifled new investment, as well as reducing the return on existing investments.

Estimates show that annual world-wide investment in renewable energy needs to increase four-fold to \$1 trillion in order to meet international climate change targets in the coming years.

Australia is well placed to capitalise on this increased investment, with abundant renewable resources and a stable political and economic environment.

We are also well placed to attract investment from China and Europe, with the Federal Government having recently signed a free trade agreement with China, and proposing to negotiate a free trade agreement with the European Union.

Dr John Hewson AM spoke about Climate Change, and the need to maintain the current Renewable Energy Target, as being one beyond politics. He called on the Liberal Government to meet its pre-election commitment to maintain the current Renewable Energy Target commenting, "if you're talking about barnacles, get rid of this one."

Professor Ross Garnaut AO, discussed the underlying economics influencing the sector and explained that Australia has a natural advantage for low-cost production of renewable energy. He explained how the low cost of renewables would create a cost advantage for local industry into the long-term future.

The Summit heard of the key role that renewable energy technologies could play in driving innovation and kick-starting local advanced manufacturing activity in an area of growing international demand.

Kane Thornton, Chief Executive of the Clean Energy Council, highlighted the impact already being felt by workers in our clean energy sector. He reflected that the current situation has resulted from a

vacuum of vision for Australia's energy sector and political uncertainty and warned that the cost of continuing uncertainty is great. Mr Thornton also noted that, of 144 jurisdictions with renewable energy targets, none were looking to reduce these except Australia.

Summit attendees called on the Federal Government to urgently abandon changes to the RET that would risk billions of dollars in investment and thousands of jobs, by effectively creating an environment of sovereign risk, jeopardising Australia's reputation as a country of choice for renewable energy investment.

Summit attendees also called on the Government and the Opposition to commit to a durable bipartisan agreement on the Renewable Energy Target that ends ongoing uncertainty and secures employment and investment.
